BLUES WHITTLE DOWN GIANTS TO BOY SIZE

When the Los Angeles Colored Giants played here last February, they handed the Blues a shut-out after one of the toughest battles the local diamond has ever seen. But when the scorekeeper closed the books last Sunday, there was a different story to tell. Very different. Because this time the Blues were on the long end of the 7 to 5 score, and the Giants were trailing.

Turner, a new left-hander, was in the box for Torrance. His first two innings were not so good. He hit Jackson the first man up, and Adams sacrificed him to second from where Jackson scored on Anderson's hit to short center where a juggling act let in a run and placed Anderson on second. Fast work on the part of Bouett cleaned the slate, when he accepted McGinnis' pop fly and tossed to Clayburn who touched Anderson before he could get back to second. This nifty double enthused the fans, who went wild with glee in the third when another double was pulled off at the expense of Adams and Anderson. Adams drew a pass to start the inning, and Anderson was safe at first on an error when Turner flied the ball but threw to first too late to make the out.

When McGinnis grounded to short, Adams was trapped between third and home. Rennie chased him back to the bag and tossed to Wolfe who tagged Adams out and whipped the ball to Clayburn to catch Anderson off second. This display of speed wilted the colored gentlemen and from then on Turner and his mates had them well in hand. However, the Giants had managed to pile up a 4-run lead and things looked dark for the Blues.

Torrance took to Charleston in their half of the third. Rennie singled and Turner followed with a double. Rice sacrificed. Clayburn grounded out. Bouett connected with a triple. Wolfe and Johnny Ducauzat drew passes. Atwood was safe on an error on which Bouett and Wolfe scored. Flinker struck out. Four runs knocked the count. Two more in the fifth and one in the sixth gave the Torrance boys a good lead.

A little wobbling in the eighth on the part of the Blues let the Giants score one more run but that was their swan song. About the only pleasure the Giants had in a troublesome afternoon was when Frenchie, batting for Ducauzat in the seventh, struck out. Mator Johnson, ardent Giant follower, surmised did enjoy that, yesuh.

Slowtime Evans, famous pitcher and globe-trotter, held down first base for the Giants, evidently held in reserve for mound duty, but for some reason he was not called to the box.
