The appearance of these distinguished artists features a bill that includes such well known contributors as Charles Wakefield Cadman who will accompany Master Billy Lannon, noted boy tenor, in a cycle of new Cadman and Carrie Jacobs-Bond songs; Homer Gunn, composer- pianist, in the presentation of an original suite; Tudor Williams, renowned baritone; the Aeolian Harp Ensemble with Elizabeth Hughes; and an Ernest Belcher, ballet of premier dancers.

NEW INDUSTRY FOR PITTSBURG IS ANNOUNCED

Shell Chemical Company To Build Nitrogen Fixation Plant

Announcement was received here this week that the Shell Chemical Company, a subsidiary of the Shell Oil Company of California, will locate a nitrogen fixation plant at Pittsburg, Calif., at a reported cost of \$7,000,000. The huge plant will be erected on a 613 acre site directly opposite the Enes tract facing the water front on New York slough. It was reported that it is approximately 2 1/2 miles from Pittsburg, in what has been known as suburban territory.

Construction work on the first unit of the chemical concern, reported to become the largest plant of its kind on the Pacific Coast, will begin at once, it was learned here.

News despatches from the northern city state that the new chemical plant will prove an "inestimable boon to California oil industry since the industry will use natural gas in its processes." It was also pointed out that the Pittsburg industrial area was victorious over Long Beach as that latter city had waged a powerful fight to have the plant located in Southern California. However, widespread benefits for the state and country as a whole are seen as a result of the establishment of the plant.

Nitrogen from Air

Of interest to Torrance and the surrounding oil fields is the report from Pittsburg that "a further benefit will be in its effect on the oil industry since hydrogen from natural gas will be used in its manufacturing process, thus utilizing quantities of another California product."

It is believed that the chemical plant is to be the only one of its kind on the Pacific Coast manufacturing fertilizers by a process of extracting nitrogen from the air. The Shell Chemical Company is reported to have purchased the site for its factory from J. J. Fitzgerald, city clerk of Pittsburg.
