

#### Wilmington Adopts Proposed Width

That Wilmington does not intend to change its views on the width of O and N streets and that Long Beach should not change its stand on the width of State street as links in the proposed extension of the Roosevelt Highway was indicated this week in a letter from the Wilmington Chamber of Commerce to the Long Beach city council.  
The chamber reaffirmed Wilmington's opinion that 80 feet, including sidewalks, is wide enough and that Long Beach should have the same width for State street, declaring that the residents on that thoroughfare are not in favor of a 100-foot street.


