Grid Season for Torrance High Starts Oct. 10; League Divided

Torrance High school's 1930 football team will play a new schedule when the Marine League season opens October 10. Since the entry of three new high schools in the league, El Segundo, Southgate and Adolph Leuzinger at Lawndale, the league has been divided into two divisions. Division 1 for football includes Washington, Riis, Jordan, Bell, Gardena and Narbonne. Division 2 will be composed of Torrance, Banning, El Segundo, Southgate and Leuzinger.

Each division will play a schedule among its members and one game with a school in the other division.

To Award Trophies

Trophies will be awarded for football only in each division and a committee has been appointed to work out a system of awarding a trophy for basketball, it is announced.

The winner of Division 2 will move to Division 1 and low team in Division 1 will move to Division 2 in each sport in the 1931-32 season, it is reported. Plans for the sports season for the league were made at a recent meeting of principals of league high schools.

During his years at Pomona, Clarence Bishop has won varsity football, basketball and track letters and has also played on the baseball team. He has been coached by Coaches Nixon, Heath, and Merritt of the Sagehen institution at "the best natural athlete ever developed at Pomona."

The Compton Edison squad are third, the three leaders each added one victory to their total while the Compton Athletic Association nine lost one and the Telephone team went down to defeat twice.

The fast Long Beach Edison team is now credited with seven wins and no defeats. The Tansey men are 5-1-1, one-half of a game of the leaders with eight wins and one defeat. They defeated the Compton Telephone squad, 8 to 4, last week. Their next game will be played with the Long Beach Edison leaders and should definitely settle the race for the championship.

COUNTY GETS LARGE SHARE OF AUTO TAX

SACRAMENTO. — The Division of Motor Vehicles announced today that \$319,220.71 was collected in motor vehicle registration fees during the first six months of 1930, of which \$6,167,151.52 is being apportioned equally between counties and the State Division of Highways for repair and maintenance of roads.

Los Angeles county, where 892,725 motor vehicles and trailers were registered during the six-month period, receives an apportionment of \$1,259,315.56. This is the largest single apportionment. San Francisco county's share is \$231,122.73 on 147,508 registrations and Alameda county ranks third highest with \$219,622.06 on 140,168 registrations. Alpine county, registering 91 vehicles receives \$142.58, the smallest apportionment.

Registrations on motor vehicles and trailers during the first six months in 1930 totaled 1,968,012 or 108,489 more than during the similar period in 1929.

Questionnaire On Pictures Is Sent Out

Passengers on Cruise To South America Are Quizzed

Unique in its type is a questionnaire being sent out by the Los Angeles Steamship Company to passengers who have booked for the LASSCO South American cruise this fall. That will sail from Los Angeles harbor October 8th. The questionnaire does not ask the color of their eyes or the place of their birth but inquires rather into the type of pictures the individual voyager plans to take.

"Will you have a kodak, movie camera, or both?" LASSCO wants to know. "Will you carry films with you, and if so how many? Will you want to take colored motion pictures?" These and several others are included in the questionnaire.

It is not mere curiosity that has brought about LASSCO's display of inquisitiveness, but is an effort to render a very unusual service to members of the cruise, according to company officials.

The company has secured Andre LaVarre, internationally known photographer now in Paris, to accompany the ship throughout the voyage and will place his experience at the disposal of all passengers. LaVarre is to be available not only to supervise the work of his assistants in the technical end of developing and printing films of passengers, but will himself be a "walking encyclopedia" of information as to proper procedure in the varying incidents the best points from which to take views, how many to take and what is wrong with the poor ones.


