"Endorsements" Favoring Fitts Said Inaccurate

Young's Chairman Points Out Numerous Instances of Errors

Inclusion of the name of a minister who has been dead nearly two years and numerous other inaccuracies in a list of pastors claimed to have endorsed Baron Fitts for governor have been charged by R. Gordon Boyd, chairman of the committee of 1000 Southern California ministers and laymen supporting Governor C. C. Young for re-nomination.

"Dr. A. W. Lamport, Vernon Vincent M. E. Church" is listed among the ministerial endorsements of Mr. Fitts in a list sent out by Fitts campaign headquarters," said Mr. Boyd.

"This piece of publicity is not unlike other Fitts statements, for Dr. Lamport's obituary appeared in the 1929 Methodist Journal, and there is no such church."

Count Nazarene Pastors

In the same Fitts statement, Mr. Boyd said, it was declared that 476 Nazarene ministers had endorsed Fitts when, in reality, there are less than a dozen pastors of that faith in this section of the state. "Another name on the Fitts list is 'Rev. F. L. Platt of Whittier,'" Mr. Boyd continued. "So far as we have been able to learn there is no Rev. F. L. Platt of Whittier, but Mr. F. L. Platt is chairman of the Whittier Committee for Governor Young."

Rev. W. H. Geistweil, an interdenominational pastor of the First Baptist church, Los Angeles, is included in the list.

Denies Endorsement

"How my name was secured and by what right it was published is something I do not understand and I certainly deny and condemn its use in this connection," Dr. Geistweil said.

A total of 21 inaccuracies in a list of less than 100 names were pointed out by Mr. Boyd, including the asserted endorsement of Fitts by Rev. Allan A. Hunter, Mount Hollywood Congregational church. "Our office has an endorsement of Governor Young signed by Rev. Mr. Hunter and he absolutely repudiates it having endorsed Mr. Fitts," Mr. Boyd stated.

SEN. LYON IS APPROVED BY MANY CLUBS

W. C. T. U. Lends Endorsement to Candidate Who is Much Sought For

Among the endorsements of the candidacy of Senator Chas. W. Lyon for re-election which have come during the week are those of the W. C. T. U. of Long Beach, Artesia, Burnett, Compton, Norwalk and Sawtelle.

Mrs. Lily C. Richardson, president of the Los Angeles County W. C. T. U. has added her endorsement also.

The Latin-American Social and Political Club and the Southside Public Affairs Association have joined the ranks of civic organizations which have endorsed the Senator's candidacy. Senator Lyon is busily engaged with speaking dates and is averaging three to four speeches a day on invitation of various societies and organizations.

'BOOKKEEPER' RILEY KEEPS STATE CLEAN

Is Also Collector of State Tax Money; Every Cent Accounted For

"Keeping the books for a business whose annual transactions involve \$135,000,000 is one of my duties as State Controller," said Ray L. Riley, speaking before the Women's Political League in Los Angeles.

"Another phase of my activities as State Controller is the collection of all state tax revenues. Last year my office collected approximately \$50,000,000 franchise taxes, \$22,000,000 gasoline taxes, \$10,300,000 inheritance taxes, \$3,500,000 corporation income taxes, and \$1,500,000 motor truck transportation taxes," he said.

"During my administration, antiquated bookkeeping has been replaced by modern cost accounting. In 1924 for the first time in seventy-five years the people of California knew to a penny the cost of state government for the prior year," Mr. Riley concluded.
