Indian Summer Excursion Plan

A special Indian Summer "chickadee" - "chickadee" - "chickadee" excursion from Los Angeles to Long Beach to San Francisco will be operated by the Los Angeles Steamship Company on its coastwise liner Yale, sailing from Los Angeles harbor, Wilmington, at 2 p. m., Friday, September 19. A minimum low round-trip rate of \$19, with 24-day return limit, will be in effect for the sailing.

As the low fare includes, in addition to approximately 200 miles of travel, a three meal aboard ship and two nights lodging during the journey, the rate makes the actual transportation cost considerably less than a cent a mile. Practically a third of the total passenger space aboard the Yale is available at the 24-day round-trip rate for the September 19 sailing, according to the LASCOC passenger officer. The round-trip rate in standard outside room will be two dollars additional and the round-trip rate for de luxe accommodations \$29.

HOLLYWOOD'S FILM SHOP

HOLLYWOOD, (UP)—Arithmetic may not be a favorite subject in school, but to most people figures tell a stronger story than words. Merchants advertise that 1,000,000 people use a certain product; publishers state that 50,000 read a certain book; even social leaders adapt themselves to the new mathematical order of things and send notices to society editors telling the number of guests invited to this and that function.

A motion picture company set aside \$2,000,000 for one film, and expects it to be four months in the making. This alone establishes it as a picture of the first magnitude. But "The Big Trail," the production in question, offers many other figures that speak for themselves.

The story of Hal G. Everts required 93 principals, each with a speaking part and 20,000 extras, almost one-third of them to be professional, the rest to be employed on location. Director Raoul Walsh assembled a medical corps composed of a doctor and four nurses to accompany the unit on location; wardrobe accommodations numbering 14, Indian guides and interpreters, number 12, and 237 horse wranglers, stock herders, cow punchers, bull whackers, mule skinner, harness makers and blacksmith. Screen debuts were made by 1800 head of cattle, 1500 horses, 10 mules, 500 burros, 20 pigs, 11 dogs, 200 chickens, 20 wild turkeys, 11 colts, 3 bear cubs and 2 full grown black bears. Another item was 185 prairie schooners.

The location department of the Fox Film studios, sent scouts into various states to find places which would fit into the background of a picture based on the courageous march of pioneers into the west. Locations were spotted after they had been visited by Director Walsh, had covered 14,000 miles in sixteen states, and camps of tents and shacks were constructed to house hundreds of people and care for thousands of animals.

Seven hundred and twenty-five Indians, members of the Blackfoot, Shoshone, Arapahoe, Crow and Cheyenne tribes, were taken from government reservations to locations. Then, when all was in readiness, Director Raoul Walsh took his unit, including 200 technicians and 22 cameramen, and a cast headed by John Wayne, Marguerite Churchill, David Rollins, El Brendel and Tully Marshall, on location. During the four months of filming this production, the unit covered 1400 miles.
