Awarding Contract on First Boulder Dam Unit



Union Pacific officials award contract for the first unit of the \$165,000,000 Boulder dam project. In celebration of commencement of work on the entire project, Secretary of Interior Wilbur has sponsored a national celebration at Las Vegas, Nev., September 17. At work on bids for the Union Pacific branch line marking the initial construction work, are: Left to right, seated, R. L. Adamson, chief engineer; J. H. Marcotte, chief clerk, and standing, W. R. Armstrong, general superintendent; F. H. Knickerbocker, general manager; A. B. DeFries, bridge engineer, and C. B. Reynolds, construction engineer.

First work on the Boulder Dam project will be done by the Merritt-Chapman & Scott Corporation of San Pedro, awarded the contract for the preparation of the roadbed for 22 miles of Union Pacific branch line to serve in the Boulder Dam construction.

The award was made by R. L. Adamson, chief engineer of the Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railroad, western unit of the Union Pacific system, as low bidder of the 19 contractors who submitted estimates. The bid of \$115,000 was accepted for the grading, trestle, and culvert work which is to be completed by December 26th. The branch line will operate from the Union Pacific main line seven miles south of Las Vegas to Summit, selected by Dr. Edwood Mead, commissioner of reclamation, as the site for the model city to house 2000 workmen and their families during the eight years of construction work.


