LEUZINGER IS TARTARS' LAST OPPONENT FOR THIS SEASON

Hawthorne Field to Be Scene of Local Team's Curtain Appearance in 1930 Gridiron Combat

At 2:30 o'clock tomorrow, Friday afternoon, the Torrance Tartars will trot out on Leuzinger's high school field in Hawthorne for the last game of the season.

They are prepared to beat Leuzinger—if training and Coach's Field's and Smith's instructions are carried out. They will beat Leuzinger if the boys put everything they've got into that final curtain game.

There are a number of the 1930 team who will be playing their last game for the Maroon and Grey and as a special tribute to them, Principal Herbert S. Wood and the coaches are making an urgent appeal to the townspeople to attend the game at Hawthorne.

Last week the Torrance team drew a bye—a layoff that helped the squad get in shape for the Leuzinger fracas. Word comes from Hawthorne that the Tartar opponents are a bit heavier than the local team, but the dope scratches both teams about even. The game will start promptly at 2:30 o'clock. The curtain will fall on Marine League football about two hours later—and win, lose or tie, Torrance will have finished a better season than anytime in the past.


