

County Settles State Accounts

Los Angeles county has just completed settling its accounts with the state of California, according to an announcement by State Controller Ray L. Riley.

The total amount turned over to the state by the county's treasurer was \$6,450,632.13, representing six months' collections, most of which was inheritance taxes.

During the period covered by the settlement, the 58 counties in California collected a grand total of \$10,421,472.32, the largest sum turned over to the state in many years.
