**The Western Rose Garden**  
In the West and particularly in the sub-tropic sections, it has been than to plant roses indiscriminately among other garden plants, T. Nursery, suggested this week.  
Planted to themselves in a rose garden, they may be given the attention and culture that suits them best, and this without interfering with other garden plants, Kimura reports.  
In a climate where roses grow the year round, or nearly so, it is well to practice the summer rest period. This applies to the rose garden which is more than a year old. Withholding the water for about six weeks in mid-summer cures the plants down to some extent without drying them off to the point of injury. In an arid climate irrigating is generally considered the best method of applying water; however, they may be sprinkled successfully if sufficient water is applied to penetrate the soil to a good depth. In the spring when aphids and thrips appear, spray for the control of these insects. Also spray with a fungicide and dust occasionally with dusting sulphur to prevent mildew. The Gardena nursery owner said.
