S. P. to Feature Dollar Day Fare Again, April 3, 4

The Southern Pacific Company will again feature Dollar Day Excursion fares for departure on Friday and Saturday, April 3 and 4, according to announcement made today by Lawson Overman, district passenger agent of that company.

All tickets will have a return limit of midnight Thursday, April 5, tickets being good on all trains and sold to all points on the Pacific System of the Southern Pacific Lines, which includes all points in California, Oregon, Utah, Nevada, Arizona and New Mexico.

These special excursion fares are established on the basis of \$1.00 for each 100 miles and were first put into effect during February, 1931, and have created considerable additional traffic, according to Mr. Overman. 



