Today Betty Says:
PROPER garnishes have much to do with the success of a meal. Serve little lemon pigs with some dish that requires lemon juice and they will win the hearts of your guests. Better still, the more they squeeze the helpful juice from the little pigs, the more vitamins, minerals and salts they will add to their meal.
Use cloves for eyes, halt toothpicks for legs, and half a lemon-rind, turned inside out and decorated with a sprig or two of parsley or water cress, for a hat.
Lemons may be served in dozens of attractive forms as garnishes for spinach, fish, oysters and other foods. A slice on the rim of a tea cup is a good idea, too.

Assemblyman Hill in Statement On His Reapportionment Stand
The following statement has been received from Assemblyman Ben A. Hill in regard to his stand on the state reapportionment bill, the now being hotly waged in Sacramento. Hill writes:
"Much has been said the last few weeks, in the Southern California press, about reapportionment, in the legislature, and it appears to me that the people are entitled to know the facts which have happened since then."
"Certain newspapers, civic organizations and individuals have criticized the attitude of a few of the Los Angeles County assemblymen for the attitude taken by us on reapportionment, without giving the true facts to the people. The facts at least partially are as follows: The two Craig bills have been passed by the Assembly giving Los Angeles 31 assemblymen and seven congressmen, which bills I voted for."
"The McKimley committee of the congressional bill, stating that I thought it should have provided for eight congressmen for Los Angeles County—11 for Southern California; however, I preferred this to a reapportionment failure. The McKimley committee, the senate providing only 30 assemblymen for Los Angeles, and the newspapers of the South, and many of the civic organizations insisted that we vote for it on the assumption that the senate would pass a bill giving Los Angeles eight congressmen; some of us refused to be led into a trap which might result in Los Angeles getting only 30 assemblymen and only seven congressmen."
Senate Must Show Good Faith
"The McKimley bill came before the reapportionment committee of the assembly on last Thursday, and an amendment was offered, inserting the Craig bill in place of the McKimley bill. I rejected the amendment and fought against it on the ground that we had already sent the Craig bill to the floor of which they had rejected, and that it was our duty now to draft a different bill, still standing out for the 31 assemblymen to which we are entitled; the amendment carried nevertheless, and after taking the same fight to the floor of the Assembly, the amendment was adopted, against my protest."
"Today the bill as amended came up for vote in the Assembly, and having succeeded in getting three other assemblymen to join with me in my attitude, we mustered sufficient strength to postpone action on the bill as amended to Thursday of this week, on the proposal of Senate members that during the meantime the Senate will pass and send to the Assembly a bill providing for 30 assemblymen, and a companion bill providing for eight congressmen. I feel confident that every assemblyman from Los Angeles and every assemblyman from Southern California will fight for support and vote for these bills if the Senate will pass them and send them over to the Assembly. But likewise, I feel confident that there are enough assemblymen from Los Angeles who have the interest of the people at heart, who will not be so "generous" as to give away one assemblyman which belongs to Los Angeles, on the mere promise of some few senators that they in turn will give us eight congressmen. When the people realize that two-thirds of the Senate are from the North, they must also know that the Senate must show their good faith and pass a bill for eight congressmen before they ask us to be so generous."
"It is my belief, the opinions of all the newspapers and civic organizations to the contrary notwithstanding, that the people of Los Angeles County are being best protected by the few Los Angeles County assemblymen who refuse to be intimidated into following a program which might result in Los Angeles County and the South being tricked out of an assemblyman and also a congressman. If these few of us can withstand the fight and bring home reapportionment without the loss of either an assemblyman or a congressman, or both, we will feel that we have succeeded."


LOMITA Briefs

Baby Chicks at Easter Time

"Never saw so many eggs in my life!"
"An' lookit the thousands of baby chicks!"
These exclamations are frequent when visitors are taken through the Goddard Hatchery at 17601 South Normandie avenue, Gardena, just three miles north of Torrance.
Right now is the best time to see the Goddard Hatchery. There are thousands and thousands of baby chicks just coming out of their shells and creating the traditional Easter note to the enterprise near Torrance. Visitors are cordially welcomed at the hatchery and breeding yards.
A beautiful large courtyard, shaded by pepper trees, provides ample parking space. The buildings, in the California-Spanish style of architecture, house the most modern incubating equipment on the Pacific Coast. Two large Hobbs incubators with a separate hatcher (a vital factor in producing a chick of superior quality) are here installed.
The total capacity at one time is 85,000 eggs, or about four tons. These eggs come from 25 master breeders' flocks under the personal supervision of Mr. Goddard, who is a director of the American Poultry Association Hatchery Project and who was largely in the spotlight last year when his pen of Australorps won first in the heavy breed class at the 18th National Egg Laying Contest at Mountain Grove, Missouri. He also won first cockerel and first pullet at Madison Square Garden.



