Redondo Academy Moves to Torrance

pend under the city's supervision for physical betterments on the building to be used in the establishment of the Torrance Military Academy.

Work Started Now
Later in the week, Colonel Ingersoll told Smith that he would start elaborate improvement work on the building in a few weeks in order that the academy might move into its new home in June. The school's executive stated that he would open the institution this fall with an enrollment of between 150 and 200 boys. At the present time there are 104 boys attending the Redondo Military Academy. Because of the school's limited space, 34 boys had to be refused entrance last September, the colonel stated.

Aquisition of the academy brings to Torrance an establishment worth about \$75,000 per year in expenditures for such items as salaries, commissary, furnishings and other supplies.

War Department Rating
In addition to this sum, there would be recognized the value of the academy's equipment which are, a great extent, supplied locally. Colonel Ingersoll is justly proud of the record of his school. It having an official War Department rating and a scholastic standing of enviable reputation. The academy has War Department equipment valued at \$75,000 in its stores rooms. This includes the latest model Springfield army rifles, ammunition, side arms and supplies.

"What I would like to stress most in presenting the word picture of my school to the people of Torrance is the great scope of its advertising," the founder of the institution said yesterday. "Our catalogs go all over the world and we draw boys from many states in the union. I will be glad to change the name of the school to the Torrance Military Academy and make such change in all our literature and on our uniforms and insignias."

To Use Local Labor
The new construction and reconstruction work on the U-shaped building to be occupied by the academy will cost approximately \$7000. It is estimated. This expense will be born by Colonel Ingersoll. The chamber's fund will be used to seal the building on the interior.

Local labor and materials will be used wherever possible, the school's executive assured the chamber directors.

"Of course the price must be right—but I believe that Torrance firms can compete favorably in every way with outside contractors," Colonel Ingersoll stated.

The school is a 12-months institution and its educational program includes from the first grade to the tenth. It follows the Los Angeles County Board of Education curriculum and uses the same books as are used in county schools.

Disabled in World War
Colonel Ingersoll is a man of broad military and executive experience, having been a commissioned officer in the United States Army, and is now retired through disability received in the line of duty in France during the World War.

After regaining his health, Colonel Ingersoll was appointed commanding officer at the large government post at Goshen, New York. From there he was promoted and transferred to the New York City district as a special expert in the United States Veterans' Bureau. One year later he was appointed commanding officer of the largest government hospital in the country at Chelsea, New York. He was the founder of a military academy at Long Beach before coming to Redondo five years ago.

Between 15,000 and 20,000 Attend Children's Easter

Attendance at the first presentation of the Children's Easter Sunrise service at Roosevelt Memorial Park has been estimated from 15,000 to 20,000, according to reports from a group of persons qualified to make such estimates. Over 2800 automobiles were parked inside the park and several hundred more lined the highways leading to the scene of the Easter morning service.

The entire program was a credit and distinction to the many persons and organizations who labored for several weeks perfecting the plans for the first all-children-all-Harbor District service. There was not a single mishap or accident reported to mar the event.

Those in charge of the program, Albert H. Deeks, Mrs. Margaria Etischen and Principal Herbert S. Wood, of the Torrance High school; Principal C. A. Whittely, of Gardena High school; Dr. Stevens of the Spanish-American Institute, American Legion and Boy Scout executives, expressed themselves as being highly repaid for their efforts in behalf of the service. The students from the three schools entered in the spirit of the service in a very commendable manner and much credit is due them for their singing and speaking performances.

Plans are already under way for similar observations at the Roosevelt Memorial Park and without a doubt another children's Easter Sunrise service will be held next year.

The executives announced that hundreds of people were inspecting the tract daily and that it was their belief all of the remaining lots and houses would be easily disposed of in the sale.

Allen, auctioneer of the Frank Melne Company, stated he was gratified with the response of the people to this offering and gave as his opinion the reason for this was the lots lie midway between Los Angeles and Long Beach on main highways. Allen announced the auction opens Friday night, April 17, at 7:30 and continues Saturday and Sunday, April 18 and 19, at 2:30 and 7:30 p. m.


