

MODEL PLAN FOR PROPOSED PARK

Here's What Torrance Could Have for A Recreational Center if Bond Issue is Approved by Voters at Special Election to be Held, June 9

Wouldn't you be proud to live in a city that had a municipal recreation center such as this one, designed this week by City Engineer Frank R. Leonard and sketched by Herbert J. Summers in the city engineer's office?

A municipal park, to be of the greatest service and convenience to people of every walk of life, must encompass all the facilities necessary to their wholesome pleasure at being out-of-doors, enjoying many kinds of recreation.

This was the premise upon which City Engineer Frank R. Leonard designed the above proposed plan for a Torrance Municipal Park, bonds for which will be voted on by the people June 9.

By quartering any site the city may choose to purchase—and no location has been considered for a park as yet—as the council prefers to await the decision of Torrance citizens June 9—Leonard believes that the utmost in park facilities can be obtained in a natural artistic setting.

should be an integral part of any park plan. This provides a setting of rare beauty. Surrounded by a circular driveway, this gem of landscaping includes a sunken garden with lawns, flower beds, shrubbery and old English rose garden.

In the lower left quarter we find the plan that can accommodate the main entrance to the entire park. Imagine driving along a street in Torrance, turning into the avenue adjoining this entrance and being greeted by a lovely landscape of lawns and large palm trees spaced at wide intervals!

Work For Many Local Men Adjoining the central drive in the lower right sector are located large auto parks—no need to leave your car on the street—in this plan. The great national game is given a prominent location in this quarter with ample seating capacity included around the diamond.

To build it will require the services of many men for several months—or even longer if all its details are to be faithfully carried out. This work comes at a time when the entire nation is striving to produce jobs for men who badly need employment.

Don't you think it is worth it? Especially, if the plan proposed, whereby the bonds' interest and redemption costs are paid from the fund given by the city for advertising and promotion purposes with no increase in taxes—is carried out? Doesn't Torrance need a park to keep abreast of the other surrounding communities?
