Half-Year Justice Court Report Shows Judicial Accomplishments

Within a few minutes after the close of the Lomita Justice court's first half-year period, Tuesday afternoon, Mrs. Bertha Wilcox, clerk of the court, had completed the six months' report required by the Board of Supervisors. And bright and early yesterday morning the court opened all ready to start the last half of its fiscal year with new books. Mrs. Wilcox' report shows that Judge John Dennis presided in 112 criminal cases and in 73 civil matters. Fines collected during the six months' period totaled \$783 and fees, collected in the small claims court and civil cases, amounted to \$217.50.
