50 Different Sets Used in "The Secret Six"

Fifty separate and distinct sets, ranging from a replica of a city street, that was changed three times in its entirety, to a penthouse on the roof of a great office building, were used in the filming of "The Secret Six," Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's vivid drama of political life and the underworld, coming tonight, Friday and Saturday to the Torrance Theater.

The dramatic story traces the rise and fall of a crooked city politician boss who rules the underworld to use it as a tool to gain political power. Wallace Beery plays the principal role as Scorpio, the stockyards worker who becomes political czar of a city.

Among the sensational scenes, involving in many cases, elaborate inventions for recording and filming, are the blowing apart of a player piano with machine guns, a sensational night battle of vigilantes and the herds of the underworld, and a breath-taking race in speed boats. An entire replica of a city street was constructed near the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer studios, first set up in 1928, then razed and rebuilt as it might have looked four or five years later, and then once more razed and rebuilt as of 1931.
