Tax Board Says Public Utilities Leases Taxable

SACRAMENTO. — Removal of thousands of dollars in property from the assessment roll of Los Angeles County has been averted by the state board of equalization. The board this week ruled that property leased to public utility corporations, operating under a state gross receipts tax, would not be removed from the local tax-ation rolls.

Following a decision by the State Supreme Court last June, requiring Los Angeles County to return to Morgan Adams, Inc., taxes collected on a building leased to the Southern California Telephone Company, a number of public utilities filed reports with the equalization board this year asking that the property rented by them be entirely relieved from local taxation.

These claims were protested by county assessors who urged the board to declare that the landlords' interest in the leased property could still be taxed locally notwithstanding the Morgan Adams case. To hold otherwise, the assessors claimed, would result in large revenue losses to cities and counties throughout the state.

Educator Surplus Creates Problem In State, Report

SACRAMENTO. — While California gradually is solving its "teacher unemployment" problem, there still is a substantial surplus of educators in the state.

This condition is revealed in a report compiled by the division of teacher training and certification, state department of education, and submitted to Governor Rolph. During the last year, only 2890 new teachers were employed in California, while 3433 new teachers were certified. Of the total, Los Angeles County employed 850 new teachers.

In a comparison of figures of previous years, there is an indication of a gradual "leveling out" of the teacher surplus, according to the department of education. In 1927-28 the excess of supply over demand was 3385; in 1929-30, 1248, and in 1930-31, 812.

Probe Conduct Of McDonald Special 'Cop'

A delegation of 10 residents of the McDonald Tract told the City Council Tuesday night in no uncertain terms that they believed M. O. Sullivan, special officer for that district, was unfit for his position and that they did not want any police service whatever.

The group, headed by W. A. Gillham, recounted asserted acts unbecoming a gentleman and an officer which they said were "disgracefully inflicted" upon them by Sullivan. Mayor Dennis and Councilman R. R. Smith, police commissioner, informed the group that the matter of the part-time officer's conduct is being thoroughly investigated and that a full report would be made and action taken at an early date.

Among the accused officer's alleged offenses were the indiscriminate display of his badge and gun and the public use of the "short and ugly" word directed at a McDonald resident in a school meeting. Sullivan is said to be a dairyman in the McDonald Tract. He has been receiving \$50 a month salary for part-time duty for several months.

partment. The two men whose lives were snuffed out yesterday were understood to have quarreled considerably over one old bill of \$95 after they dissolved their partnership.

Kingsley had stopped at the Arlington address to deliver ice. As he came out of the house, Shugru drove up in a small sedan. A heated conversation ensued and then Kingsley was seen by the two women witnesses to run from Shugru, who had drawn a revolver. They ran around the house and out into the open field, Shugru firing at Kingsley. There they struggled over Shugru's revolver. Three shots followed in quick succession and Kingsley dropped.

The asserted murderer then turned and ran about 35 feet toward the house. He stopped, reloaded his empty .38-calibre pistol and shot himself through the right temple. Dr. E. E. Carlson of Gardena pronounced both men dead a few minutes after the Gardena constable, Clarence Lane, arrived on the scene with the physician. One empty shell was found in the revolver lying by Shugru's hand.
