C. W. Koerner, Candidate For Position, Withdraws To End Fight

C. W. Koerner, district manager for the Southern California Edison Company for the Torrance-Redondo district, broke the deadlock existing in the city of Pasadena last week over the selection of a city manager by voluntarily withdrawing his name as candidate for the position. C. W. Charleville, city manager of Glendale, was appointed to the office after Koerner had written the Pasadena Board of Directors that he was out of the contest. Koerner, who was Pasadena's first city manager, has released his letter to the city directors, and it is as follows: "When asked if I would allow my name to be used in connection with the appointment of City Manager, I stated that I would not make formal application, but that if the people wanted me I would allow my name to be used under the following conditions: 1. That the Manager's duties would not be encroached upon by the Board. 2. That the compensation would be the same as that which I formerly received when City Manager. 3. That I would have the support of each member of all those who have expressed their confidence in me."
