PARIS—Just 17 years after their wartime invasion of this country, throngs of Germans are flocking to the Western Front of France. But their invasion this year is essentially a peaceful one, for they are coming to visit the graves of relatives who died during the great war and are buried in France.

Stag Hunting Costly TORQUAY, Devonshire, Eng.—Stag hunting is believed to be the most costly sport in Britain. Estimates place the expense of killing a stag at about \$5,000. The cost of shooting a grouse is about \$5 to \$10 and each pheasant has a gross cost of about \$10 to \$12.

Old Gold Vein Worked TONOPAH, Nev.—Rediscovery of a famous vein, which produced over \$100,000, at Great Gulch mine, has led to intensive prospecting for gold. New vein assaying \$24 per ton and getting larger, reports said.
