The balance will be paid to the Society at the rate of \$37 per month, according to City Clerk Bartlett, who is acting as treasurer for the city workers' fund. The employees in the city clerk's, city engineer's, and city treasurer and city attorney are contributing a percentage of their monthly pay checks.
