Fund Created To Aid Unemployed

Savings On City Light Bill To Provide Work

A special "unemployment fund" was created by the city council Tuesday night on motion by Councilman G. A. R. Steiner in order that the money saved by the city on street lighting may be segregated from other city funds.

City Engineer Leonard reported that his office has received no more complaints about the reduced street lighting since adjustments were made in various parts of the city after the first announcement of the proposed illumination was made. He said he believed the lighting was favorable to all residents now.

The city expects to save approximately \$150 a month by "spotting" the street lights so that all intersections will have two lights, a main light in the middle of blocks where the tree growth is heavy and almost normal illumination in the business districts.

Accuse School Authorities of "Passing Buck"

Board's Request For More Data On Street Work Rapped By Council

The old army game of "passing the buck" was charged to the Board of Education by city officials in council meeting Monday night when they thought of the proposed improvement in the Vista Highlands district surrounding the Fern Avenue school. Instead of either endorsing the project or rejecting it, the Board of Education asked for more detailed information on the proposed improvement—material which was forwarded to them at the time of the city's request for a commitment.

None of the questions asked by the city engineer on instructions from the council were answered by the school executives, Leonard said. However, the city council, knowing the benefits that will be derived by the property owners in that section and the relief such improvement work will afford unemployment, decided to comply with the Board of Education's request and more information will be sent.

In this next communication to the Los Angeles school authorities there will be one new proposal—that of paving the streets in the district with macadam instead of the more expensive asphaltic concrete. Macadam streets in Torrance have given very fine service. It was testified to by members of the council and Street Superintendent Gascoigne and this type of pavement can be laid from four to six cents less per square foot. In the aggregate this would be a saving of about \$30,000 on the entire project. City Engineer Leonard said.
