Tasty Tidbits
French Dressing (Makes about 1/2 cup)
3 tablespoons lemon juice
6 tablespoons salad oil
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon paprika
Stir or shake thoroughly before serving.
To French dressing add gradually 2 tablespoons of some cheese of piquant flavor as Roquefort or snappy cheese which has been rubbed to a cream. Blend until smooth and you have an excellent cheese dressing.

Cumberland Sauce for Duck (Serves 4-6)
1-3 cup orange juice
1-4 cup lemon juice
1 cup powdered sugar
2 tablespoons currant jelly
Grated rind 1 orange
Grated rind 1 lemon
1 tablespoon grated horseradish.
Mix ingredients; beat thoroughly; heat and serve.

Party Picklement
Here is a recipe that will help make your party a decided success. Unusual? Of course! But it is easy to follow, and the results are surprisingly good.
Party Pepper Salad
2 green peppers
2 packages (6 ounces) cream cheese
6 sardines
1/2 cup dill pickle, finely chopped
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
Wash peppers and remove seeds and membrane. Mash cream cheese and sardines to a paste. Add chopped dill pickle and seasonings. Pack mixture tightly into pepper cases. Chill in refrigerator until ready to use. To serve slice thin, sprinkle each slice with paprika and serve on crisp lettuce with French dressing or mayonnaise.

Tuna Catch Shows No Shortage Here

SACRAMENTO.—(U.P.)—There should be no shortage of canned tuna on the tables of California families. During the first seven months of the year approximately 46,000,000 pounds of tuna were received by the canneries of Southern California, the state department of public health reports. The department further reported that 396,640 pounds of raw fish and 1,321 pounds of cooked fish were rejected by inspectors as failing to meet state pure food requirements.
