





Lutherans Prove Appreciation of New Pastor By Buying Parsonage

Torrance Lutherans wish to introduce to the community their new pastor, Rev. Frank D. Mechling, who came here recently from Columbus, Ohio, where he had served one congregation for 15 years. Rev. Mechling and Mrs. Mechling have lived up to their advance recommendation as being experienced in missionary work at large and also for their keen interest in Christian work among the young people. The short time that they have been in Torrance proves they are soul winners and friends to the friendless, members of the congregation declare.

The First Evangelical Lutheran church of Torrance, which is often called "the friendly church," was organized in September, 1925. Members of the congregation first held their services in the Legion clubhouse. Five years ago they bought a lot at the corner of Sonoma and Acaecia avenues where, on the rear of the property, they built a chapel on parish hall, reserving the front for their church building which they now hope to erect in the not too distant future.

Rev. W. Lange, now of Compton, organized the church. After completing his part of the missionary work here he was sent to Torrance and Rev. George Schuster, of Inglewood, served Torrance for more than four years. The territory grew so large that the synod felt the need of a resident pastor at the local church and Rev. Mechling with his wife answered the call of this congregation.

Members of the church are deeply appreciative of their pastor's sacrifice to come to Torrance. The Mechlings left a beautiful \$90,000 church, a better salary, relatives and life-long friends in the Ohio city when they heard the call of the need of missionary work in the California Lutheran field.

When the news came that Rev. Mechling would take over the pastorate, members of the church decided a parsonage was needed and in September this year, purchased the Spanish-type stucco residence at 1610 Acaecia avenue, adjoining the church property. This is where the Mechlings now live and they will administer to anyone needing spiritual guidance or assistance at that address.

Lutheran services are held in the parish hall every Sunday morning at 10:45 o'clock, and Sunday school convenes at 9:30 a. m. Everyone in Torrance and vicinity is cordially invited to attend these services, being assured of a hearty welcome.
