Grubb's Market Enlarged
"We have stressed the point of convenience to the average buyer in designing the new store," Manager Swinney declared. "An enlarged stock will be carried in all lines of foods and the well-known MacMarr standard of courtesy will continue to be the watchword of the store."

The interior of the market has been entirely repainted in white and green; all products are plainly listed as to price and conveniently arranged; the store has been enlarged by lengthening its depth and removing a partition that formerly divided the vegetable department from the store proper.

The change in the store's appearance has also been carried out by Henry Grubb for his meat market. This has been redecorated, a larger refrigerator installed and the showcases renovated to their original splendor.

Title of Picture Is Declared Grievous Misnomer

If ever a motion picture was mis-named it is "The Sin of Madelon Claudet," because this stirring drama, which will be shown two days, next Sunday and Monday, at the Torrance Theatre is a searching analysis of mother love rather than the "sin" of anything, according to critics who have found it one of the year's greatest talkie productions.

The story is one of tremendous emotional sweep, depicting the melodramatic career of a woman who sinks to the lowest depths for the sake of her child. The picture is said to be marked with the same stirring qualities and stark drama which characterized "Stella Dallas" and "Madame X," the nature of the plot leaving room for an adroit blending of romance and the extremes of comedy and tragedy.

Great Opportunities
The central role of Madelon, the French girl who is deserted by her lover and subsequently becomes the victim of a series of amazing circumstances, is played by Helen Hayes, the New York stage star, who makes her first screen appearance in this production. The role gives Miss Hayes every opportunity for a display of her remarkable talents as an actress, for she is seen first as an attractive young girl, and then, as the progress of the story continues over a period of years, appears as an old, disillusioned and haggard woman.

Prominent roles are played by Lewis Stone, as the Count who raises the status of Madelon from that of a lowly woman to mistress of a luxurious home, only to result in her being sent to prison later; and by Neil Hamilton, as the American artist with whom Madelon elopes but with whom she has only a short-lived happiness. Most of the comedy material is in the hands of Cliff Edwards and Marie Prevost as a newly married couple who enjoy fighting almost as much as loving.
