

SCHOOL DAYS LAST LONGER IN L. A. CO.

Los Angeles county children stick with their studies over a longer period of years than do children of Eastern counties. This was disclosed here in a study, by the state department of education showing that of a total of 97,880 children in the county between the ages of 13 and 20 years, 34,019 or 34.5 per cent are still attending school.

"California's opportunities for education, unexcelled by any other state in the country, are largely responsible for this condition," the department said. "Here we provide the incentive for education and the children take full advantage of it."

Coast States Lead U. S.
For example, the state of California has a total of 263,272 persons between 15 and 20, of whom 87,804, or 33.4 per cent are still attending school. This is considered an unusually good record as compared with other states of the union. Ten years ago in California the percentage was 21.3. The average school attendance for this age in the United States at large is 21.4 per cent, the tables showed. The Pacific coast states of Washington, Oregon and California had the highest percentage of any geographical division in the country, with 22.9 per cent.
