

## TAX SLASH OF 30% IS DEMANDED

A non-partisan movement based on the platform of a 30 per cent reduction in state, county and city taxes which was founded in San Pedro recently by pioneer-resident John T. Gaffey, who calls it the Los Angeles Taxpayers' League, was reported to have formed a branch in Torrance this week. Inquiries at the Chamber of Commerce and city hall revealed that no official notice has been received here of the movement.

However, Gaffey, capitalist and former publisher, announced that more than 1750 San Pedroites have joined his league and that branches were now formed in Wilmington, Torrance, Harbor City and Lomita. Fifty petitions are being circulated for more members throughout the Harbor District and Gaffey feels the movement will sweep the county.

Successful. Elsewhere How the 30 per cent savings demanded can be accomplished and where the savings are to come from can be determined later, the founder of the movement said this week.

"When organized throughout the county, and our momentum is splendid, a committee will be appointed to work out means of accomplishing our wishes. The movement has swept Oregon, Washington, Kansas, North Carolina and other states and has been successful in every case," he said. "Ours is a non-partisan movement, not intended to interfere except to obtain the objects of the League," Gaffey continued. "One of the main attractions of Southern California is to provide outsiders with homes; but they won't continue to come, and live here, unless the taxpayers unite by the scores of thousands and demand tax reduction."

## Theft of Carrots Results In \$10 Fine

Found guilty of the charge of petty theft of 46 worth of carrots from the James Yoshinobu truck farm near Hawthorne and Torrance boulevards, William B. Hungerford, of Hawthorne, paid a fine of \$10 after a lengthy Justice court session Monday. The charge against Hungerford was the result of a complaint by S. Mieda, foreman for Yoshinobu, who testified that he caught the defendant in the carrot patch. Hungerford fled from the scene, the Japanese said, but not before the farmer got the license of his car. The Hawthorne man pleaded not guilty to the charge, declaring he was only looking at his car and had been fixing it when seen by the Japanese.
