Edison Company Plans To Spend Huge Sum In South Bay District

Expenditure of \$315,000 will be made by the Southern California Edison Company Ltd. in the Torrance-Redondo Beach district this year, according to the announcement today of C. W. Kolner, district manager. A total of \$250,000 will be expended for the building up of distribution lines and substations and other expansion of the company's service facilities in the district. Payroll funds amounting to \$65,000 will be distributed in the district during 1932.

New domestic, industrial and agricultural business amounting to approximately 180,000 horsepower is anticipated by the company for this year from present consumers as well as the 27,000 new consumers who are expected to apply for service during the twelve months. The extensions and reinforcements to be made in this district during the year are planned to care for the district's share of this anticipated new load.

The program of new work to be done in this district, in addition to the general distribution system reinforcements and extensions, includes the addition of approximately 5,150 horsepower of new service capacity in the local substations. Principal substation improvements will be made at the Howard, Inglewood, Torrance and Victoria stations. The program also includes the establishment of a new commercial office at Torrance to better serve customers of the company in that section. In December of last year work was started on the installation of new equipment at the Redondo Beach substation to care for increased service capacity. This work called for the expenditure of \$18,000. Expenditure during 1931 in the district likewise included \$50,000 for the construction and equipment of a new district store and garage. This district includes Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, Lomita, Gardena, Manhattan, Torrance, Moneta and Palos Verdes. This district, Mr. Kolner said, is one of the fastest growing areas on the entire Edison system, and during the year just ended contributed materially to the growth recorded by the company. Each community of this district, where the Edison company program of expansion has been continuous over a long period of years, is tied in closely with other sections of the Edison system and with all the company's facilities for the transmission and distribution of electric energy. The company this year will spend a construction budget of \$11,897,000 throughout its territory in Southern and Central California. More than 50 per cent of the capital expenditures will be for distribution line extensions and substation improvements, the balance of the total being used for other betterments of general character.
