

CHURCHES OF CHRIST, SCIENTIST
"Doctrine of Atonement" is the subject of the Lesson-Sermon on Sunday, April 17, in all Christian Science churches, branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass. The Golden Text is from the epistle to the Hebrews: "Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation."
Among the Bible selections in the Lesson-Sermon are these verses from Paul's letter to Titus, "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works."
A passage from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy, states, "We cannot choose for ourselves, but must work out our salvation in the way Jesus taught."

"Circuit Rider" Will Deliver Addresses Here

Noted Chautauqua Speaker Will Be Heard Next Week In Popular Lectures

Marshall Louis Mertins, known to radio fans as "The Circuit Rider," and well known as a lecturer in Torrance, will deliver six popular addresses which he has given on Chautauqua and Lyceum tours all over the United States and Canada, in the Methodist church here. The series, which is sponsored by the Torrance Men's Bible Class and other religious organizations, will begin Sunday night and run nightly.
Mertins was heard in his masterful address, "Play Ball," by 2000 men, women and children in the ball park at the Bible class barbecue last week. He has often spoken before churches and clubs in this city. His first appearance was made at the Chautauqua held here in 1919.

Opening Sunday night, he will give his most famous lecture, "The Gold at the Rainbow's End," which he has delivered before two million people. He will speak Monday night on "Excess Baggage"; Tuesday night the topic will be "The Making of a Prodigal"; Wednesday night, "Getting Into the King Row"; Thursday night, "The Stars in Their Courses," and Friday night, "The Master Key." These lectures all are of a popular nature, full of laughs, but with a message worth while. The lecture on Thursday night will be a popularization of the modern theories of astronomy. No admission is charged, but "Bill" Morris, president of the Bible class, announces that a silver offering will be taken every night.
Friday night will be devoted to the Parliament of American Patriots, "The Master Key" being specially designed for that organization. However, the public, also, will be invited.

He was the principal speaker last Friday night at the Men's Class barbecue, using as his subject, "Play Ball." It is expected that the various pastors and churches will co-operate in conducting the meetings through the week.
