Redland School Tax Is 60 Cents Less Than Torrance

REDLANDS.—The Redlands school district tax will be cut from \$1.14 as of last year to \$1.04 this year. H. G. Clement, superintendent of schools, has announced. The savings will be effected by a reduction in the number of teachers, abolition of sick leave for the teachers, a reduction in capital expenditures and curtailment of expenditures for supplies and equipment.

The school tax in the Los Angeles city district, of which Torrance is a part, was \$1.62 last year, and school officials predict that it will be increased from 5 cents to 10 cents this year.
