A special train for the accommodation of Iowans will be run by the Santa Fe leaving Los Angeles at 12:01 a. m., May 22, one minute after midnight May 21) reaching Kansas City at 6 a. m., May 24. On arrival at Kansas City standard and tourist sleepers will be delivered to the Chicago Great Western for a special train leaving Kansas City at 7 a. m., reaching Des Moines at 1 p. m., enabling passengers to make connections for central Iowa points. Morning connections will be made with the Milwaukee, Rock Island, Burlington and Missouri Pacific lines via Omaha for all Iowa points.

Commenting on the occasion the pastor said: "The upper room experiences as the background of Pentecost seem to emphasize two things primarily. The first of these is unity of purpose and action with God. Varied races, nations, classes or colors do not hinder the coming of the Holy Spirit, but He cannot function properly through groups that are not of one accord. The second emphasis of the upper room experience is that of prayer and meditation. It was a time apart for communion with the Father while waiting for the fulfillment of their Lord's promises. Minister and church workers should remember the fact that Pentecost has been selected by practically all of the Protestant and Greek churches as the special day for emphasizing Christian union. We have been slow to appreciate the significance of the Pentecostal observance. This year there should be a unanimous celebration of the day and its message throughout Christendom."
