### Saline Content Water Increases In This Section

Tests being made in water wells in the district lying to the east and west of Torrance, to determine the salinity of the water, will be continued through the summer, E. C. Eaton, chief county flood control engineer, said today, and the plan being mapped out by the district to combat the influx of salt water into fresh water strata will not be put into effect for several months yet.

Recently it was announced that tests throughout the county, and especially south of Nigger slough and in Redondo Beach, had revealed that ground water basin was highly contaminated with salt. Fifteen grains of salt per gallon has been given as the maximum amount allowable for general usage, while seven of 18 wells examined in the Nigger slough area were found to contain from 15 to 300 grains of salt, while the other 11 ranged from 2 to 15 grains.

Flood waters coming down from the mountains to the north and northeast of Torrance seep into the underground basins as far south as the Baldwin Hills and the Dominguez Hills. However, a subterranean barrier of some kind exists on a line drawn between these two points, and fresh water penetrates the subterranean reservoirs no further toward the ocean.

Result of this, according to Eaton, is that the salt water from the ocean is seeping in, while ranchers and water companies are pumping out the fresh water.

The remedy for this, Eaton states, is to sink a line of shafts approximately 100 feet deep, penetrating this barrier, and flood these shafts with fresh water stored in Nigger slough during rains. This would raise the fresh water level, he states.

### Seek Renewal of Lease Contract

Negotiations are pending for the lease of storage space for road machinery in Lomita, with Mrs. Lulu E. Towne. A similar lease has been held with George W. Towne, who died since the agreement was made July 11, 1931. Supervisor John R. Quinn has the matter under consideration. A rental of \$120 annually is called for in the lease. Equipment for county road district No. 408 is stored on the land at the present time.

### FARM HOUSES FILLED

MUSKEGON, Mich.—(U.P.)—A "back-to-the-farm" movement has filled farmhouses abandoned during the boom times of 1927-28. Five hundred families from Muskegon have returned to farms. The Muskegon welfare department has placed 60 families on farms during the past six months.


