Elaborate Plans For Developing Alondra Park Prepared By County

Complete topographic and grading plans have been drawn for Alondra Park by skilled draftsmen given part-time work in the county regional planning commission offices, with funds provided by the county employees' unemployment relief fund. It was stated today by Charles S. Diggs, director. This is the park, located north of Riverside-Rodondo boulevard, between Prairie and Cypress avenues, which a group of taxpayers has recently asked the board of supervisors to hold in abeyance.

A perspective of the 319-acre park development as proposed, together with plans, elevations and perspectives of four buildings, also was drawn by the men. Three men, all qualified professional men out of employment temporarily, were assigned to do this work on Alondra park under the direction of Werner Ruchti, landscape design engineer. Two of these were employed for three months and one for approximately two months, doing work on four other county park projects as well as Alondra park. The work they have done, according to Director Diggs, would have required payment of more than average salaries in ordinary times.

Projects undertaken by the regional planning office, using money from the 2 per cent relief fund, included in addition to park layout design, traffic surveys, an industrial survey, and preparation of numerous maps from which future work will in many instances be based. Wages totaling \$15,808 were paid, which represents savings of \$57,300 for the work performed, meaning that it would have cost the commission approximately \$100,000 had the work been done in normal times, according to Director Diggs.

State Appraiser Commends C. of Torrance

A letter dated August 3, directed to L. G. Gilmeister, assistant secretary of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, and signed by Henry Morrissey, state inheritance tax appraiser, praises the local body for its work in compiling data relating to property here. The letter says: "I am very glad to have this opportunity to commend you for the efficient manner in which you have provided your community with valuable information relating to property values for assessment purposes, and to enable anyone to promptly locate real estate in your city, avoiding the necessity and inconvenience of securing such information from the county assessor's records. 'We seldom find these subsidiary records, in the course of our very exacting work of appraising and your people should be complimented upon having such a thorough organization working for them.'"

Around the Council Table

WARNING: City Clerk Bartlett states that he has been instructed by the city council to collect all delinquent business license fees at once. A number of Torrance firms and individuals engaged in business are in arrears in their license payments.

A new license ordinance regulating dogs and other animals was introduced for its first reading. The annual license fee for male dogs is \$2 and for female dogs, \$1. A boarding fee of 30 cents per day is charged for dogs held in pound. Violations of the ordinance are punishable by a fine of \$100 or 90 days in jail, or both.

A request to operate a sanitarium at her residence, 729 Border avenue, was made by Margaret Shelby, a registered nurse. The matter was referred to the city engineer.

Regular meetings of the council will be held hereafter on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month at 7:45 p. m., according to action taken this week. The next meeting will be held August 23.

A proposal to furnish fleet insurance for all city automobiles by Wallace Gilbert, agent, was referred to committee.

The Edison company was instructed to bill the city for current lighting bills of 58 street lights in South Torrance district recently annexed. The order becomes effective September 1.

A grant deed was accepted from C. C. M. O. giving right-of-way conveyances for Sepulveda boulevard through the company's property.

Quinn Advocates National Training Civil Service School

Supervisor John R. Quinn in a broadcast from the city hall radio station, advocated the founding of a national civil service training school with federal aid where students would be instructed and trained exclusively for positions in government service. The supervisor outlined a plan to finance such a school and declared, "Just as soon as I can get the sentiment toward such a school as I have in mind it is my purpose to consult the national administration regarding it. I thoroughly believe that it is high time something is done to create a genuine desire for a career in the public service on the part of those already in the service as well as on the part of those who are contemplating entering it."

School Budgets Higher In City and J. C. Dist.

L. A. System and Compton Junior College Ask For More Money

Compton Junior College is the only district in the county to put in a school budget larger than asked for 1931-32. It was revealed today in a check of the various estimates filed by the five junior college districts, more than a dozen high school districts, and several more elementary school districts.

Comparison of the figures shows that Compton Junior College asks for a total budget of \$140,371 as compared with \$118,059 for 1931-32. Only approximately \$8000 of this amount is for increased salaries, being \$75,934 this year as compared with \$66,876 last year. Los Angeles city school system, serving Torrance, leads all high school district budgets with \$14,888,065 for 1932-33 as compared with \$13,250,182 for last year. Long Beach district asks \$1,663,140 this year as against \$2,187,606 last year. Pasadena is a close third in the county with \$1,235,625 asked for this year as compared with \$1,576,688 last year.

Increased budgets are asked by five district. Palos Verdes, La Verne, South Pasadena, Newhall and Saugus. To raise additional revenue, the board of directors of the Palos Verdes elementary school district held a special election last July 26 and voted to increase the maximum special district tax rate for school purposes other than building, from 30 cents to 45 cents on each \$100 of taxable property.

Los Angeles city's elementary budget this year is \$16,785,713 as against \$20,345,000 last year. Long Beach district asks \$1,663,140 this year as against \$2,187,606 last year. Pasadena is a close third in the county with \$1,235,625 asked for this year as compared with \$1,576,688 last year.

Rescind Action In Improvement of 254th Street

Proceedings for the improvement of 254th street from Belle Porte to the west city boundary of the shoeing addition, were rescinded by the Los Angeles city council this week on recommendation of its public works committee. More than 30 street improvement projects throughout the city were abandoned by the council. A survey was made of all uncompleted projects several months ago.
