Fall Semester At Evening Hi Opens Monday

Torrance People Invited to Enroll in Night Classes

Torrance evening high school will open on Monday evening, September 12, at 7:00 o'clock for enrollment. The classes that are to be formed will depend on the number enrolling. The following are suggested as possibilities based on the work last year:

Arts and crafts, commercial work (typing, shorthand, bookkeeping), sewing, Americanization, English, Spanish and French, woodshop, machine shop, men's physical education, women's physical education, mathematics (arithmetic, algebra, geometry, trigonometry and mechanical drawing).

The arts and crafts classes will meet Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings as last year under the direction of Miss Chase. She will give special attention to the making of Christmas cards and presents, stressing the use of inexpensive materials. The handicraft taught will include pottery and leatherwork. Several students have requested instruction in commercial art. If ten students register for it, a class will be formed.

Mrs. Beyers, the teacher of the French and Spanish classes is in France. Her classes will not start until she returns which will be the first of October. Those who wish to take this work should enroll at the beginning of the semester as usual.

The other classes will be conducted along about the same lines as previously.

The board of education has seen fit to cut the appropriation for evening schools considerably under what it was last year. This will mean that those classes whose enrollment is largest will be allowed the better chance to continue. The number of classes to be scheduled will depend on the interest shown by the people of Torrance and vicinity.
