

## THE CHRISTMAS DINNER

Christmas holly bedecks the mantel, there's mistletoe, gay red bells and a twinkling tree in the living room at the Christmas season, but if you want to find an even merrier, busier, more enticing spot—come out into the kitchen! Kitchens, all over the world, at this season, are fairly bubbling with good things—spices, sweets and surprises. Swing open that big oak door that lets you into a kitchen in Germany. It has been a festive place for weeks and weeks. Mother in an ample apron and daughter with her flaxen braids hobnobbing about, are busy right now making spicy little Christmas cookies and cutting them in shapes of stars and bears and moons and rabbits. And just over the border in that little Austrian cottage kitchen, there are tantalizing smells of freshly baking bread. Two great loaves have gone into the oven to bake for the Christmas feast—one to represent the Old Testament and one to represent the New Testament. There are fine fruits in that big basket on the table and fat jars of golden honey to eat on the big loaves of bread.

"To Set Before the King"  
In royal, as well as cottage kitchens, Christmas feasts are being prepared. Screw up your courage and peek into the splendor of the royal kitchen. Again, something sweet—it's plum pudding and mince pie—English dishes that are being prepared in every part of the British Isles. There will be a savory addition to the double sirloin of beef, known as "baron beef" which is served annually at the feast in Buckingham Palace. And at home, what? Well there are certain Christmas foods that we would soon omit from the menu as we would neglect to light the Christmas candles. The Christmas fowl with stuffing, for example, is traditional and the mince pie which we inherited along with the goose from our English ancestors. Let's write them down first on the menu, but then let's have something different, too, this year.

Something Different  
We can borrow these from kitchens far and near. Paris, for example, contributes our Holly Canapes, Delaware our Consomme with Oysters, and the Grape Fruit and Grape Salad is a brand new salad which is very much in vogue right now.

Here are the recipes for these festive foods for your Christmas feast.

Holly Canapes: Sauté rounds of bread lightly in olive oil or butter.

Consomme with Oysters: Heat to boiling the contents of two cans of consomme and two cups of water. Heat the contents of a five-ounce can of oysters in their own liquor, bringing just to the boiling point. Add to the broth, and season to taste with celery and ordinary salt.

Brussels Sprouts and Chestnuts: Drain the liquor from two cups of canned Brussels Sprouts (saving the liquor to be used another time in soup) and saute gently in butter for about five minutes. Boil one cup of shelled chestnuts until tender, remove the skins and saute them in two tablespoons butter and two teaspoons sugar until they are brown. Combine with the sprouts, and season to taste. Add a little liquid from the sprouts if necessary.

Grape Fruit and Grape Salad: Drain and chill the contents of a No. 2 can of grapefruit and one cup of seeded white grapes. Make a French dressing using grape fruit juice instead of vinegar. Arrange the fruit on lettuce hearts and pour over the dressing. Garnish each salad with a star of pimiento placed inside a ring of green pepper.


