Supervisor Chairman Advocates County Sales Tax to Aid Relief

A resolution advocating a sales tax system to produce revenue with which to enable Los Angeles county to cope with its unemployment relief problem was passed unanimously by the board of supervisors Monday on recommendation of Chairman Frank L. Shaw.

The sales tax would relieve real estate from the burden of carrying federal loans for welfare relief, Shaw pointed out, adding that every taxpayer in the county was vitally concerned on this point. Similar to Gas Tax

"By this sales tax, which would be similar to the state gasoline tax now in effect, the state could place upon commodities a revenue-producing tax ample to provide for the repayment of loans made to the relief of unemployment and charity stress," the resolution read. The present intention of Governor James Rolph to borrow money from the Reconstruction Finance Corporation to aid destitute residents of Torrance and other cities of the county would be illegal, the board of supervisors has been advised by the county counsel.

Against Bond Issue
"A bond issue would only be a greater burden upon the property and real estate of the already overburdened taxpayers of this county," Shaw declared. "And yet, only by the voting of a bond issue could citizens of the county protect the repayment of money borrowed from the R. C. F."

Shaw stated that any increase in the tax burden on real estate should, in his opinion, be vigorously opposed.

"It is my belief that only a sales tax upon commodities which are not necessities can solve our problem of obtaining relief funds from the federal government without increasing the tax on real estate," the board chairman stated.

Subdivisions In Future Must Conform to Plan

Supervisors Adopt Resolution of County Planning Commission Affecting Area

All future preliminary and final subdivision plans, dedications and acquisitions of property in the southerly part of Los Angeles county, including Torrance, Gardena, Lomita and adjacent areas, must hereafter conform with plans for through highways.

This important order, which paves the way for a comprehensive network of through highways extending over the entire county, was contained in a resolution adopted by the board of supervisors this week.

The resolution adopted by the supervisors entrusts the carrying out of the plan to the county surveyor, county road department, planning commissions of the various cities embraced, city engineers, realty owners and subdividers. The resolution reads, in part:

"It is the sense of this board of supervisors that this comprehensive regional plan of highways in this area constitutes the basic framework for future development and is conducive to the best development of the county as one community." The comprehensive network of through highways has been worked out after several years of detailed study by the county Regional Planning Commission.

The Regional Planning Commission was authorized by the supervisors to make a comprehensive highway study by a resolution adopted May 21, 1923. The county was divided into seven sections and the San Gabriel valley section was the first studied. The highway plan for this area has been adopted.

Aged Woman Dies At Daughter's Home

Johanna C. Von Barm, aged 76, of 2319 Maricopa, died early Wednesday morning, victim of cerebral hemorrhage. She had lived here with her daughter, Norma A. Swanson, for the past three and a half years.

The deceased is now at Stone and Myers funeral parlors, and the body will be shipped tonight to Antioch, California, for burial.

File Condemnation Suit For Crossing Over P. E. at 253rd

Suit in condemnation, to obtain the right-of-way needed for the new crossing over the Pacific Electric tracks on 253rd street, between Amaranth and Normandie avenues, was filed in Los Angeles superior court last week by the city of Los Angeles.

The parcel of land which the city seeks to condemn is 60 by 70 feet, according to the complaint and accompanying map.
