

Rules Governing Baseball Park Are Announced

Field Is Open to General Public Provided Arrangements Are Made With City Clerk

General rules governing the new municipal ball park were announced last night by Councilman Scott Ludlow, chairman of the park committee. Ludlow explained that while the ball park is fenced in order to prevent accidents to children and others outside the grounds, the ball park is open to any organization or group of citizens in Torrance, providing arrangements are made with City Clerk Bartlett. The fence around the ball field will be painted a light green, Ludlow stated, and vines will be planted to cover it. It is also planned to plant a row of trees in front of the fence, so that when the vines and trees are grown, the fence will not be noticeable. In fact, in looking through the gardens in the new park proper, the ball field will appear as a grove of trees.

Tentative rules for the conduct of the ball park, as announced by Chairman Ludlow last evening, are:

1. The park may be used by the general public. Teams having regular scheduled games will be allotted time in order of request.
 2. Ball park must be self-supporting.
 3. Games may be played any day or night in the week, provided the time has not already been spoken for and the cost of lights (if used) and any other park expenses necessary to playing the games, has been guaranteed.
 4. Any games played in which a collection is taken or gate charge made, 10 per cent of the gross receipts must be turned over to the city.
 5. Permits to play will be issued at the city clerk's office, after being approved by the park commission and found not to conflict with previously scheduled games.
 6. Boys' and girls' clubs or organizations with teams may use the grounds for sports or other activities, provided adequate responsibility is assumed, for good conduct and the cost of lights and other expenses, if any, are paid.
- A police officer will be on duty during all night games, who will have charge of opening, and closing the ball park. The care of the grounds will be undertaken by the present by the city street department crews, it was agreed by the city council last evening.

Ask Estimates On Paving For Sepulveda Blvd.

Link Between Ventura and Beverly Blvds. Practically Useless

Pointing out that the city of Los Angeles has expended \$150,000 for a tunnel to carry Sepulveda boulevard under Mulholland highway for a roadway that thus far is practically useless, the Los Angeles city council has instructed its city engineer to prepare an estimate of the cost of paving the recently-graded section of Sepulveda.

The resolution, introduced by Councilman James S. McKnight of the Third (West Los Angeles) district, asked that the estimate be on the basis of a four-inch asphaltic concrete base 40 feet wide, to extend between Ventura and Beverly boulevards, a distance of several miles.

It was also pointed out that it is impossible to finance the paving of this artery by assessment district under present conditions, but that property owners have requested that a temporary surfacing be constructed in order to make the major traffic artery passable. Trucks, at least the heavier ones, would be kept off the surfaced roadway, it is understood.

The city engineer is instructed to make his report to the public works committee of the city council. District engineers of the San Fernando valley, West Los Angeles and Hollywood districts, were sent duplicate instructions and the estimate probably will be prepared by the two offices jointly, it was stated.

Meanwhile, Los Angeles county and city officials were awaiting action of the state legislature on bills which would give the county a larger share of gasoline tax monies. If the bill endorsed by the supervisors becomes law, the city undoubtedly will have the money to improve the Ventura-Beverly link with a heavy duty pavement that would accommodate truck traffic for which the artery is designed, it was declared.

Train Service Direct To Site Of Celebration

Plans Completed For Big Day at Cabazon on May 13

Automobile traffic to the Colorado river aqueduct progress celebration, at Cabazon on May 13, will be guided by highway signs posted by the Automobile Club of Southern California for the occasion, it was announced today.

All main roads throughout the San Geronimo pass region are to be posted by the auto club so that celebration traffic will be directed over highway No. 99 to Cabazon, which lies five and one-half miles east of Banning.

Meanwhile, chambers of commerce in each of the 13 member cities of the Metropolitan water district are assisting Southern Pacific officials in arranging official trains and coaches for civic delegations planning to attend the affair.

The celebration trains, which will take passengers directly to the site of the gathering, are scheduled to leave Los Angeles on the morning of Saturday, May 13, arriving at Cabazon in time for the program. A special round-trip fare of \$2 has been arranged. Chairman John G. Bullock of the celebration committee, announced yesterday that full information concerning train schedules and roads can be secured by calling the various chambers of commerce throughout the Metropolitan water district.

Colorado river water—10,000 gallons of it—was assured yesterday for the celebration when arrangements were completed for the spotting of a railway tank car of the fluid at the Cabazon siding.

A feature of the May 13 affair will be the serving of the water that is to be carried into Southern California by the Colorado river aqueduct when it is completed.

Klansmen Meet Tonight At Hall On Border Avenue




