Allocation of Funds For Highway Diverted By Board

Sepeveda boulevard and the Roosevelt highway will be one and the same through the city of El Segundo, at least for several years, it was indicated today by action of the board of supervisors.

The supervisors cancelled an allocation of \$40,000 set up May 2, 1932, which was to have been used for constructing Sepeveda boulevard between Rosecrans boulevard and Collingwood street.

Revenues from motor vehicle licenses for 1932 failed to meet the estimate by about \$100,000, and the Sepeveda allocation, which had been untouched, was one of several to be cancelled to provide funds for allocation to promised projects, it was stated.
