

Seek Permit For Transmission Line In Gardena Valley

An action to condemn a right-of-way for a high tension transmission line along the Gardena valley at Nigger Slough channel northwesterly from the corner of 216th street and Chico street, to the Long Beach boundary line has been filed in superior court.

The action is brought by the Los Angeles water and power department against James T. Aganjian, George Kardashian, and nearly a score of other property owners, the right-of-way to be condemned is 25 feet wide, and will be used for pole lines forming part of the Los Angeles loop line. It is immediately west of the Shell Oil Company's tank farm. Public interest and necessity demand that the city obtain the right-of-way, the complaint states.

Balance Due City On Fines Collected

Seven cities in Los Angeles county, including Bell, Inglewood, Pomona, San Fernando and Torrance, had a total of \$564 due them last June 30 as the balance on their city fines collected by the county and left at the county jail, according to the report of the grand jury auditors to the board of supervisors.


The auditors' report cited certain conditions at the county jail which it was urged be corrected. One of these was that a check writer be used in making withdrawal receipts when prisoners leave the jail and take their remaining money with them. The present practice of rubber-stamping a receipt and writing the amount in with pencil may be a temptation to certain employes who could easily raise a \$5 withdrawal to \$15, the grand jurors were told.
