Beer Sales Drop During September

SACRAMENTO.—Beer drinking
in California during September
was not as heavy as in August,
the state board of equalization
announced today.

A total tax of \$71,260 was col-
lected by the state in September,
representing sales of 3,563,006 gal-
lons. In August a total of 3,897,135
gallons was distributed, with a
tax of \$77,942.

Eighteen California breweries
produced 91 per cent of total dis-
tributions in the state, the board
report showed.
