Who Is the Head of a Family?

A taxpayer, though single, who supports and maintains in one household one or more individuals, who are closely connected with him by blood relationship, relationship by marriage, or by adoption, and whose right to exercise family control and provide for these dependent individuals is based upon some moral or legal obligation, is the head of a family, and entitled to the same exemption allowed a married person—\$2500. Also he may claim a \$400 credit for each dependent. For example, a widower who supports in one household an aged mother and a daughter 17 years old is entitled to an exemption of \$2500 as the head of a family, plus a credit of \$400 for each dependent, a total of \$3300. The \$400 credit, however, does not apply to the wife or husband of a taxpayer, though one may be totally dependent upon the other.

For income tax purposes there can be only one head of a family and the exemption cannot be divided. Not infrequently claims for the \$2500 exemption are received from two or more members of a family.

It should be remembered that a single person, whether or not the head of a family, is required to file a return if his or her net income for 1933 was \$1000 or more, regardless of whether the return is nontaxable by reason of the \$2500 exemption.

County to Improve Streets in Tracts Under Subdivision

Residents of more than a score of sub-divisions throughout the county where the subdivisions have failed to improve streets as they agreed to do soon will see these improvements made by the county road department, upon orders from the board of supervisors.

Legal proceedings against the subdividers and the companies who put up their surety bonds will be instituted just as soon as the county counsel can draw the complaints. The county will recover from the bondsmen and the money will reimburse the road department for the improvements that have not been carried out as agreed.

When subdividers file maps with the county they are allowed one year to complete the improvements, such as building portions of roadways, sidewalks and curbs. Decision to file suits was made when the county road department reported that 23 subdividers had not lived up to their agreements. Tract 7741 in Torrance, at Arlington and Cypress streets, is included in the list.


