Democrats Gain In Registration Since November

Total Increases to Reach a New Figure For All Parties

Registration of Democrats in Los Angeles county will be equal to that of Republicans by the date of the August primaries if Democrats continue to gain as they have for the past several months, figures indicated today. Almost as unprecedented as the growth of Democratic registration during 1932 is the gain revealed by figures released by W. M. Kerr, registrar of voters.

Registration throughout the county gained 21,766 between last November 9 and last March 29 to reach a new total of 1,184,639. Broken down, the figures show that the Democratic registration jumped from 597,770 to 827,512, a gain of 21,712, or nearly 3000 more than the jump in total registration. Every other party, with the exception of those who decline to state their party beliefs, showed losses. The decline-to-state group gained but 1165.

Republicans lost 1902 during the period, bringing their total down from 564,792 to 562,790. On November 9 they numbered 62,922 more than the Democratic total. Today it has dwindled to 33,278, all in a period of four and one-half months. Socialists lost 118, dropping to 6319; Prohibitionists lost 32 to drop to 6213, and the Liberty party lost 95, dropping to 1081.

The county's total registration is rapidly approaching the figure of 1,212,856, the last presidential election in November, 1932. Registration figures for Torrance as of March 29, show an increased total for all parties of 311, or 3250 as of November 9, 1933. Party registration, Republican and Democrat, however, shows a slight decrease as follows: March 29, 1934, figures were, Democrats 150,919; November 9, Republicans 1791, Democrats 1345.

In Lomita the registration as of March 29 shows, Republicans 10498, Democrats 1156, total of all parties 2125; on November 9, 1933, the figures were, Republicans 1929, Democrats 1964, total of all parties 3324.
