The Prom was to have been carried out in the Hawaiian motif with characteristic decorations, program, and refreshments. Plans had been nearly completed and the Prom date was set for this Friday. The World Friendship party would have been a bon voyage party as a farewell to the seniors with ships as the theme.

Gas Company In First Place In Sales Campaign

Leads Division in Refrigerator Sales for the Month of April
