Quinn Named Chairman to
Have Supervision of Eight
Departments

Supervisor John R. Quinn of the
Fourth district is given the chair-
manship of a committee having
eight of the fifty-odd county de-
partments, in the new committee
assignments made this week by
Chairman Herbert C. Legg, of
Downey, new supervisor from the
First district.

Quinn's committee, of which
Supervisors Legg and Gordon L.
McDonough are the other two
members, has supervision over the
following offices: Efficiency
bureau, mechanical department,
patriotic hall, purchasing agent,
recreation-parks and playgrounds,
recorder, sealer of weights and
measures and surveyor's depart-
ment.

Quinn also is a member of
Chairman Legg's committee of
three, having supervision over the
most important county depart-
ments. These are the agricultural
commissioner, assessor, a auditor,
supervisors, civil service, county
counsel, county library, district
attorney, janitors, labor co-ordina-
tor, registrar of voters, tax col-
lector-treasurer and the telephone
department.

With Supervisor Roger Jessup
as chairman, Quinn also is a
member of the committee having
supervision over the following:
Farm advisor, forester, justice
courts, livestock inspector, regional
planning commission, road depart-
ment and board of education.

The flood control department
and the charities department both
will be under all five board mem-
bers who will sit as a "committee
of the whole" this year, Chairman
Legg announced this week.
