Three Percent Sales Tax Goes Into Effect

Food Products Exempt From Levy Under Law Recently Adopted

Merchants and housewives alike were familiarizing themselves this week with the items to be taxed under the new three percent sales tax law, passed by the 1935 legislature, just before adjournment, which went into effect Monday, July 1.

Two bills will have to be kept in mind, it was pointed out. The sales tax proper levies 3 percent and exempts food products for human consumption, except foods prepared and served on the premises. Food products exempt from tax are defined as "cereals and cereal products, milk and milk products, oleomargarine, meat and meat products, fish and fish products, eggs and egg products, vegetables and vegetable products."

"Fruit and fruit products, spices and salt, sugar and sugar products other than candy, and confectionery, coffee and coffee substitutes, tea, cocoa and cocoa products other than candy and confectionery, but not including spirituous, malt or vinous liquors."

"Soft drinks, sodas or beverages, such as are ordinarily dispensed at bars and soda fountains or in connection therewith, nor does the term 'food products' include the furnishing, preparing or serving such tangible personal property." This the letter of the law, it was explained.

The other sales tax bill, approved by the legislature would apply a 3 percent tax on the "use, consumption and storage in California of tangible personal property received in interstate commerce from other states." The state board of equalization is given jurisdiction over this act, and may regard salesmen as the agents of dealers under whom they operate, it was explained.
