### "Idaho" Night At the Westside Auditorium, Long Beach, Friday

It will be "U.S.S. Idaho night" at the Westside Auditorium, 645 West Anaheim street, Long Beach, when Bill Boyd, heavyweight pride of the battleship Idaho, tangles with "Ace" Winchester, Golden Glove champion from Tennessee, in the main event of an all-star card Friday night.

Boyd, a strapping youth of a mere 200 pounds, has an enviable record of 20 fights, 11 knockouts and no defeats. Boyd is regarded as one of the most promising heavyweights the navy has had in recent years.

Winchester made a big hit last week when he came back to give Sailor Francis Maske a great fight after falling out of the ring and landing on his head. Winchester fought the last two rounds against Maske on his fighting instinct alone, being a bit "foggy" as a result of the fall. "Ace" is expected to give this Sailor Boyd a great battle Friday. Sailors of the Idaho have taken a block of 250 seats for Friday's show and will be on hand to cheer their scrappers.

On the other half of a double main event comes the third and crucial meeting of the sensational Benny Robello and Red Myers battles. In the top spot last Friday these boys had the fans in a frenzy during all four rounds. Robello won the decision by reason of a second-round knockdown. Myers, however, has the distinction of being the first man to knock Robello off his feet in a prize ring. This he did in a quicky without a count being made-over him. The score stands one-all in the bouts between these two boys, each having won a decision from the other. The winner of the fight Friday will be rated No. 1 man to win the Golden Glove title this year.

Sailor Clyde Newton, outstanding junior waterweight of the navy and one of the most popular athletes in the navy forces, tangles with Pancho (Baby Face) Ramirez, who is an outstanding contender in the Golden Glove tournament.

Sailor Kimball of the Idaho meets the other junior member of the Winchester family, Buddy. A great future in the fight game is predicted for these two grand Southern gentlemen, Ace and Bud.

In all there will be eight feature bouts. The curtain raiser goes on at 8:30.

Bright should be on the team that goes to Germany next year, running the 5000 meter run. One thing certain about Norman Bright, he will never beat Louis Zamperini again. The local boy has his number now... Jesse Owens proved to the world that he is human, by letting Mistuh Peacock, another colored athlete, beat him two times in the 100-meter dash and also in the broad jump. Although Owens jumped 26 feet 2 1/2 inches, this was not far enough to win, the great strutting Peacock leaped to a new world's record (if accepted) of 28 feet 3 inches. If you don't believe 28 feet is very far, sometime when you have a few moments to spare measure this distance 'off. You will be surprised!...
