

Delinquent Tax Payments Ahead Of Last Year

Improved Business Conditions Reflected in Increased Collections

Regarded as a most favorable omen of improved business conditions, delinquent tax payments this year are \$1,200,000 ahead of collections for the corresponding period of 1934, according to the county auditor's office.

With the addition of more than a half million dollars for October, payments for the year were brought to \$3,765,690. For the corresponding ten months of 1934, collections totaled but \$2,595,539.

Payments during October amounted to \$512,753.69. This was some \$300,000 under payments that totaled \$829,771 for October of 1934, but last year delinquent property owners had held back their payments until September and October. Payments during July and August were very light last year, while this year collections have been large during both August and September.

Until April 20, 1936, property may be redeemed from tax sales without penalties, according to T. E. Tanner, chief of the redemption division of the county auditor's office. Interest will be charged at the rate of 7 percent per annum, however, computed from July 1, 1934.



be extended over a 10-year period. The plan must be adopted by next April 20, however, or it cannot be used. The first payment consists of all interest then due, plus 10 percent of the delinquent taxes. Subsequent payments are likewise 10 percent of the original delinquent taxes, plus all interest which has accrued on the unpaid balance. At least one 10 percent payment must be made each fiscal year by April 20.


