It would be suspected that when people rush about it's because of some good reason. Perhaps going to a fire, or something like that. It has been said that there's a surplus of leisure in America, but that everybody is in more of a hurry than ever before. Automobiles are made faster than ever. People drive faster than ever. They even die faster than ever. Most persons think the dare-devil aerial stuntist plays fast and loose with life. They say, "I wouldn't do that." They shudder when they see a window cleaner hanging by a life belt, high above the street. Most persons say, "I wouldn't do that." They watch with bated breath the structural steel worker walking almost gingerly around on the skeleton of a huge skyscraper. None of that for the average person.

The stunts of the rope walker, the trapeze performer, the high diver and all his brothers and sisters are not pursuits for the mere-run of individuals. Not by a jug full. But few drivers regard in a serious light the hazards of motoring.

To most there's nothing to worry about when a car is being driven at high rates of speed, or when a curve or corner is taken sharply, or when another car is met almost head-on at the top of a hill. The record of the occurrence of automobile accidents last year—the smashing of cars with trains, against trees and telephone poles and against bridges, the wrecking of cars going off the road, and the collision of cars at innumerable places—all go to indicate that many drivers don't realize the constant risks which only the utmost care makes it possible to avoid.

representatives are directly answerable to their own group of employees, and there are no restrictions on the choice of the employees as to whom they want to represent them. Almost without exception, the representatives have shown themselves to be fearless, fair-minded, and diligent spokesmen for the employees.

"About 90 percent of the employees voted at the annual elections of representatives recently conducted. This is to me clear evidence that the plan is satisfactory to the employees. Yet it is this very plan that this group of organizers declare they will destroy. The plan itself provides that it may be discarded at any time by action of a majority of the employees at any plant voting in a referendum election. And that is the only way the plan can be abrogated—even the management cannot rescind it.

"Through this plan, both men and management have learned the benefits of working together in peace and harmony. They have learned too, that they have one and the same interest—the success of the business.

"It is thru success alone that

the business will be able to pay the highest possible wages in the industry and offer the best working conditions. Those who endanger the success of the industry by stirring up troubles are enemies of all who earn their living in the business.

"Be not misled by the promises of false prophets who may appear in your midst for the sole purpose of creating discord and discontent for their own personal advantage.

"The United States Steel Corporation has always stood for the open shop and will continue to do so.

"It will never require employees to belong to any union in order to gain employment.

"On the contrary, it will defend their right to work, free from outside interference and coercion.
