

**Plead Guilty to Unlicensed Sales**



**Free Bowl Program to Dedicate Hammond Organ**

October 11 when they will sing in a program dedicating the new Hammond Electric organ being presented to the Bowl by the Easter Sunrise Service Committee. Inset shows C. E. Presentation ceremonies for the new Hammond Electric organ which has been purchased by the Hollywood Easter Sunrise Service committee and which will be given to the Hollywood Bowl have been arranged for Sunday, October 11, according to Mrs. Burdette H. Chapman, chairman of the Committee which puts on the annual Easter Sunrise service in Hollywood. In order to make the affair a gala one, a special committee consisting of Carl Bush, Carl Jacobson, Don Chambers, George Chapman, Carl D. Kingie, Dr. James Hamilton Lamb, Dr. Cleveland Kleihauer and Dr. J. George Dorn has been named by Mrs. Chapman with Dana H. Bennett as chairman to plan the presentation. Tentative plans are for a Vesper Service, starting at 4 o'clock in the Bowl, with a massed chorus of more than 500 choir members, a soloist of national note and organists to render special selections. Special invitations are being mailed to every church organization in the Southern California area to attend this service and it is expected that a capacity congregation of more than 20,000 will fill the bowl. Mr. Bennett has planned the service for one hour which will permit those who come from a distance to return home prior to the usual Sunday evening service. "The presentation of this electric organ marks a step forward in the work of the Easter Sunrise Service committee," Mr. Bennett said. "The Committee every year endeavors to finance its Easter service at the Bowl through a voluntary collection. In this way a small surplus has been built up and the Committee is expending a portion of this surplus in a gift to the Bowl Association. "We feel that the organ will become an important adjunct in the life of the community. It will enable those who use the Bowl to have music at their command and it is the hope of the Committee that a series of Vesper services will be arranged to run throughout the year." At the last meeting of the general committee, Dr. Dorn was named chairman of a special committee which will organize two large chorus groups in the city for the dedication services. Another committee was named, with Carl Bush as chairman, to select a suitable soloist for the Vespers.

**Boulder Power Inaugural Will Include Parade**


Brilliant Spectacle Planned For Los Angeles On Oct. 9

Appropriate ceremonies, spectacular electrical demonstrations on a huge scale and a brilliantly iridescent "Light on Parade" today were included in plans for the Boulder power inaugural, which Los Angeles will hold in its civic center and on downtown streets the night of Oct. 9. "Light On Parade," it was said, will be miles in length and will include scores of ornately designed electrical floats, with beautiful girls of Los Angeles and nearby cities riding in a blaze of rainbow illumination. Bands and marching units, all gayly uniformed, have been entered in the spectacle from cities and communities for miles around Los Angeles, announcements say.

Blaze of Light  
Dr. John R. Haynes, president of the bureau of power and light, said technical engineers have evolved a plan for transforming the first electrical current from the dam, 266 miles away, into a blaze of brilliant light that will be seen for blocks around.

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
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




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
