

Tartars Upset Pirates

Radford Plunges Over Late In Second Quarter For Only Touchdown

On a plunge play over center, Radford went over for the only score of the Torrance-San Pedro game last Friday, late in the second quarter. Gilbert converted and the much feared Port City Pirates tasted defeat. Stung by their defeat at the hands of Leuzinger in the opening game of the Marine League season, the Tartars went to San Pedro filled with a fighting spirit and determination that would not be denied.

The battle raged on from end of the field to the other and excitement mounted to such a pitch that a near riot started in the stands that was quelled by police and some of the cooler spectators. A fist fight between two partisans quickly spread until about 20 combatants were mixing, with the women and children in the vicinity in great danger of being trampled in the rush. Four of the battlers were escorted outside by police to cool off a bit.

San Pedro kicked off to start the game and Amman ran the ball back 15 yards. Pupkoff made five yards over tackle, but failed to gain on his next try. Amman ran the ball out for bounds, making five yards for a first down. Schmidt cut loose around the end for a sweeping gain of 25 yards but was forced out of bounds. Amman made five yards over tackle, failed to gain on the next play and on his third found a hole thru tackle that was good for ten yards. However, he fumbled the ball and it was recovered by San Pedro.

Vladic was spilled for a four-yard loss and San Pedro kicked to Amman who was downed in his tracks. On the next two plays Amman gained 37 yards, seven over tackle and 30 on a wide end run but Torrance was offside on the play and the ball was called back. A pass from Amman to Gilbert was incomplete, Torrance offside again.

McHenry went in for Gilbert. Amman punted over the end zone and the ball went to San Pedro on their 20-yard line. A fumble was recovered by Torrance on the 21-yard line. Amman made one yard around his own right end. Schmidt made 10 yards on an end around, and Amman failed to gain on the next play but made five yards on the second down and the gain was lost on a penalty, Torrance offside. Pupkoff was smeared for a five-yard loss.

A pass from Amman to Madore was good for eight yards. A pass from Amman to Pupkoff over the goal line was incomplete. San Pedro failed to gain on their first try and Vladic made four yards, both teams offside.
