

Public Invited to Community Public Schools Week Program

Community Night, climaxing Public Schools Week, will be held in the Narbonne auditorium, Friday night, at 7:30 o'clock, April 27. Everyone in the neighboring communities is cordially invited to attend the entertainment, for which there is no admittance fee.

The program, which is a combined project of Narbonne high school, Lomita, Orange street and Harbor City elementary schools, will be opened with a selection by the Narbonne orchestra, led by Mrs. Sutcliffe.

A Mexican project will be presented by the Harbor City school, followed by a trio number (piano, cello and violin) by the Orange street school. The combined orchestras of the Lomita and Orange street schools will favor the audience with a selection.

An address, "Our Schools," will be given by John Mulken, former Narbonne student body president, who is now attending Loyola College. The Lomita school will put on a safety skit to warn students and show them how to avoid unnecessary accidents.

Next there will be a musical number by the Narbonne orchestra and a reading by the Orange street poetry class, followed by a selection from the Harbor City Glee Club. Akiko Kato, Narbonne student, will give a dance, after which the program will be concluded with a number played by the Narbonne orchestra.

Novel Trip Through Americas Offered

Arrangements were recently completed between the Santa Fe System and the Grace Line whereby the way is made easy for the traveling public to see their own country and at the same time visit our sister republics at comparatively small cost.

The traveler is carried one way by rail from his starting point to the Panama Canal, via the Spanish Americas, to California (San Francisco or Los Angeles) and return by rail to starting point.

This permits of visits on the water trip to Havana, Colombia (South America), the Panama Canal, El Salvador and Guatemala (Central America) and Mexico. On the trans-continental trip commercial centers, National Parks or other attractive points may be visited. The Grand Canyon and Yosemite National Parks, Old Santa Fe with detours to ancient cliff dwellings still inhabited and the famous Carlsbad Caverns of New Mexico are among the objectives which may be seen. The trip may also be made in the reverse direction returning by rail from New York.

All the prospective traveler is required to do is see his local railroad ticket agent and to indicate what scenic part of the United States he wishes to visit and what port he wishes to leave New Mexico for. The suit, which also enters on the ticket does the rest, giving its holder not only a close-up of his country's scenic wonders, but an insight into the living and customs of our "First Americans" and sister republics of the south through the greatest of artificial waterways—the Panama Canal.

Large Sum Asked For Injuries to Automobile Victim

Ten thousand dollars is being asked for the injuries to little Catharine Ann Caldwell, age 4 years, who was assertedly struck down and run over on 257th street near Eshelman street, Lomita, last December 18, by a sedan driven by M. E. Roberts. The suit, which also names as defendant, A. J. Blite, owner of the car, was filed this week by her father, John H. Caldwell of 25717 Eshelman street.

The child received numerous injuries including a fractured skull, concussion of the brain, and a permanent deformity to her left knee. An additional \$14,633 is asked for medical expenses. In a second cause of action the father asks \$2500 for the loss of his daughter's services.




